Dear Vendor:

SandRidge Energy, Inc. and its subsidiaries, understand the importance of good vendor relationships. These relationships could not have been developed without the continued support and cooperative effort from our many vendors. It is our policy to practice the highest standards of integrity in all of these relationships and to ensure that third parties with whom SandRidge associates exhibit the same degree of commitment to that standard.

Any gift or benefit offered to an employee in exchange for, or based on, prescribing or providing specific services or products is a violation of SandRidge's Code of Business Conduct and Ethics policy and cannot be accepted.

Business Gifts – Gifts of cash or its equivalent (gift certificates) cannot be awarded to SandRidge employees. It is SandRidge's policy to discourage employees from accepting more than incidental gifts from vendors. Management pre-approval is required for employees to accept gifts valued at more than \$100. While we appreciate the gesture of goodwill and the spirit that prompts gift giving, we believe that anything other than something of a nominal value is not appropriate for this purpose and can create the potential for conflicts of interest.

Entertainment – In the context of vendor and supplier relationships that SandRidge wishes to maintain, the offering or acceptance of entertainment should be limited to events that are appropriate to the conduct of business. Examples of such would include incidental business lunches/dinners or widely attended gatherings where the employee's attendance will further the achievement of SandRidge business objectives. As is the policy with gifts, SandRidge employees must obtain management approval before participating in entertainment with a vendor valued at more than \$100.

We ask for your understanding and request your continued cooperation in these matters when dealing with SandRidge, its subsidiaries and all of its employees.
